District 4 History

The first record of Masons in the Northern Virginia area can be found in William Mosley Brown's history of Fredericksburg Lodge No. 4 of Fredericksburg, Virginia, which records two members of that Lodge as living in Prince William County on the north side of the Rappahannock River near the mountains in 1769.

The first Masonic Lodge in Prince William County was chartered as Dumfries Lodge No. 50 in Dumfries, VA in 1797. The Lodge at Dumfries is important to Hay Market and the 58th Masonic District as most of the Masons who were instrumental in constituting the first Lodge in our area were members of that Lodge.

In his report to the Grand Lodge of 1925, Most Worshipful Charles H. Callahan noted that the 15 Lodges of the 1st and 54th Masonic Districts were too spread out for efficient administration. He recommended that they be realigned in three Districts. With the approval of the Grand Lodge, the 59th Masonic District was established with Rt. Wor. G. Walker Merchant of Manasseh as the first District Deputy Grand Master. The Lodges in the District were: Manasseh Lodge #182 (1875), Acacia Lodge #16 (1877), Herndon Lodge #264 (1897) and Drinkard Lodge #313 (1911). Herndon Lodge was in the 54th Masonic District while the other three Lodges were all originally part of the 1st Masonic District.

The Grand Lodge of 1934 reorganized the District structure, eliminating the former 58th District, and renumbering the 59th as the 58th District. The Grand Lodge of 1936 transferred Henry Lodge No.57 (1869) from the 54th to the 58th Masonic District. In 1962, Drinkard Lodge voted to change its name to Hay Market Lodge #313. A bit of Masonic trivia: Hay Market Lodge took its name from the spelling of the Town name at that time, while the Town later changed its name to one word: "Haymarket."

In 1995, District 58 was again restructured into District 4 composed of the following six Lodges – Acacia #16, Henry #57, Mt Carmel #133, Manasseh #182, Herndon #264 and Hay Market #313.

In 2010, The Patriot Lodge was placed Under Dispensation in District 4 and received its Charter on November 11, 2011. The Patriot Lodge is the first academic Lodge in Virginia, and the first degree-granting Lodge chartered in over 30 years.

In 2019 the Grand Lodge reorganized Districts and Cochran Lodge No. 271 joined the 4th Masonic District and Herndon Lodge No. 264 moved to District 2.

178th Grand Master of Masons in Virginia Most Worshipful Jack Kayle Lewis *"Building Better Leaders"*

Jack Kayle Lewis was born on August 6, 1954, in Danville, Virginia, the son of the late Ben Barker Lewis and Violet Newton Lewis. He was named to honor the memory of his father's younger brother, Jack Kayle Lewis, who was lost in action over the North Sea on July 28, 1943, when the B-17 aircraft he was a gunner in was shot down during a daylight bombing campaign in World War II.

Young Jack grew up in a home near Danville in Pittsylvania County with his parents and two sisters, Pat and Kristie. Summers were spent in activities at Kentuck Baptist Church, youth sports, and tobacco farming – the primary crop of southside Virginia. School days for the Lewis children were spent at Dan River Elementary and then Dan River High School, where Jack graduated in June of 1972 as class president.

After high school, Jack enrolled in Danville Community College in 1973. Over the next 30 years, he attended four colleges and universities. He was awarded an Associate's Degree in police science from Danville Community College, a Bachelor's Degree in criminal justice administration from Averett College, and a Master's Degree in sociology from Longwood College in May 2002.

Brother Lewis began his law enforcement career with the North Carolina Department of Corrections in 1974. The following year, he was appointed a police officer for the City of Danville and named "Police Officer of the Year" in January 1977. In 1978, he was employed by the Lynchburg Police Department, serving in a variety of assignments until his retirement as deputy chief of police in 2005. On March 28, 2005, Brother Lewis was sworn in as the chief of police for the town of Apex, North Carolina, and served that community until his retirement in 2013.

During his law enforcement career he attended numerous professional development and leadership programs. He graduated the School of Police Staff and Command at Northwestern University and the Police Executive Leadership School at the University of Richmond. Brother Jack is a life member of the International Association of Police Chiefs and the North Carolina Police Chiefs Association.

Brother Lewis was Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Kent Lodge No. 305 on April 28, 1980, in the new Lodge Hall he helped to construct, thus becoming a third generation Master Mason following his grandfather, Artwin S. Lewis (1943), and father, Ben B. Lewis (1971). Jack served as Worshipful Master in 1984, 1988, and 2013, and was chosen to represent Kent Lodge when appointed by Most Worshipful Wayne Sawyer Flora as District Deputy Grand Master for the 38th Masonic District in 2014. He then served the 38th District from 2015-2018 as the District Education Officer and as Lodge Secretary from 2015-2022. In November 2016, Brother Lewis was appointed Grand Junior Steward for the Grand Lodge of Virginia by Most Worshipful Vernon Stuart Cook. At the Grand Annual Communication in November 2017, Brother Lewis was elected Grand Junior Deacon for the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, A.F. and A.M., of Virginia.

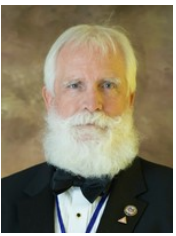

Right Worshipful Paul was born and raised in Alexandria, Virginia, where he attended Hayfield High School and entered the U.S. Navy as a Seaman Recruit Gunnersmate after graduation. After five years of active duty, he stayed in the Navy Reserves, where he obtained the rank of Chief Gunnersmate, and retired on April 9, 2002. Paul worked with many units, but it was the last two years that Paul enjoyed the most. He was the Weapons Officer for the Inshore Undersea Warfare Detachment No. 204 in Ft. Dix, New Jersey. There, he had the opportunity to work with the finest crew imaginable.

In his private life, he started working in the Information Technology field before such a thing existed. He was a Systems Engineer with Metrocall, working on all aspects that made people's pagers beep. He left Metrocall and started working for the Xerox Corporation as a tech rep, and was promoted to Field Engineer and moved to Rochester, New York, in 1994. Paul stayed in New York until 2001, when he moved to his current home in Bealeton, Virginia. Paul bought a computer service and sales franchise called "Computer Troubleshooters" in 2004. Although Paul's father and his mother's father were Worshipful Masters of Henry Knoxfield Lodge, No. 349, Paul was raised by Craftsman Roberston Lodge, No. 969, in Rochester, New York, on April 6, 1999. When Paul moved back to Virginia and joined Mt. Carmel Lodge, No. 133, in 2005, in 2010, he had moved through the chairs and became the Worshipful Master. Paul has been the District Blood Coordinator, District 4 Ritual Schools President, and District Education Officer. Paul is also a member of Manasseh Lodge, No. 182.

Paul started his college career at Northern Virginia Community College and graduated with an Associate in Science degree in 1991. When he moved to Rochester, he attended the Rochester Institute of Technology, where he fell one class short of graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Information Technology; that class was Calculus II. Resolution – Adopted February 14, 1924

To be read by the Master to the Candidate at the conclusion of the charge.

Brother _____: There is a Catechism attached to this Degree. Our Grand Lodge feels so strongly regarding the necessity of learning this Catechism that the following resolution was adopted February 14, 1924:

“That the Grand Lecturer and District Deputy Grand Masters emphasize the teaching of the Catechism of the Master Mason’s Degree in each of the Subordinate Lodges.

That the Grand Lodge of Virginia urges the stationed Officers of the Subordinate Lodges to use their influence to induce those who are raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason to learn the Catechism of the Master Mason’s Degree.

That the Masters of each Subordinate Lodge shall read this resolution to every Brother who is raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason.

Resolution – Adopted February 14, 1968

Instructions by the Worshipful Master presiding in the East immediately after the candidate is conducted out of the Lodge Room at the conclusion of the First Section of the Degree of Master Mason.

My Brethren:

A Candidate is about to be raised to the sublime Degree of Master Mason. The Lodge Room will be used as a stage to enact a drama which, symbolically unfolds the great lesson of the immortality of the soul.

To properly impress the Candidate with the seriousness of this ceremony, there must be no talking, or whispering, laughing or other commotion during the conferring of the Degree. Bear in mind the fact the Temple, for this portion of the Degree, is supposed to be silent and unoccupied.

Only the participants in the drama are to speak, and they are instructed to make no facial expressions, gestures, or unusual oral deliveries which might induce levity. The cooperation of each one here present is expected.

An adherence to these instructions will help serve as an impressive climax to the Candidate’s progress in Freemasonry and this section of the Degree could well be one of the richest experiences of his life.



The Following is Only a Suggestion



No one can truly be a Master Mason until he has mastered the teachings and principles of the Master Mason's Degree, and these can best be appreciated by a thorough knowledge of the Master Mason's Catechism.

The Institution of Freemasonry has many usages and customs with which you will become acquainted in your attendance upon Lodges and in your conversation with well-informed Brethren. There are a few I would like to emphasize at this time.

In Lodge you are to conduct yourself with decorum. You are not to move about the Lodge Room, engage in private conversations or otherwise disturb or interfere with the dignity and solemnity of the Lodge proceedings.

When you enter an open Lodge, you approach the altar, wait until the door is closed, come under the D.G of the Degree in which the Lodge is open and hold it until you are recognized by the W.M and invited to be seated.

As a member of _____ Lodge No. _____ you are entitled to ballot in this and only this Lodge. The ballot box contains white balls and black cubes. You will be called upon to cast your ballot to help decide the future membership of your Lodge, and in so doing you should let no personal feeling sway your judgment. If you believe a person will be a credit to our order, cast your ballot – a white ball in favor. If you know of any reason why the petitioner would not be a credit to our fraternity, if he is not morally fit, it is equally your duty to cast a black cube – only one being necessary to keep an unworthy person out of our ranks and help preserve, unsullied, the reputation of our fraternity.

The ballot is secret and sacred, and you will never be called upon to divulge how your ballot was cast. It is a breach of Masonic law for anyone to enquire how another has, or will cast his ballot on a petition.

You should also learn that matters brought up in a Masonic Lodge are never discussed with anyone who is not a member of the Fraternity.

To insure the three Great Lights in Masonry are in full view of the W.M. of a Lodge at all times (which silently admonishes him of his duties) you should never cross between the altar and the East while the Lodge is in session.

Your progress from now onward will depend entirely on your own efforts. May I express the hope that you will become a real student of Masonry for I can assure you that if you will travel in foreign countries of Masonic History, Masonic Symbolism, Masonic Jurisprudence and Masonic Philosophy, you will earn and receive Master's wages far beyond your best expectation.
